Areas of Interest

- Clinical Psychology is concerned with the possible causes, diagnosis, and treatment of abnormal emotions, thoughts, and behaviors.
- Neuropsychology examines the relationship between the brain and behavior
- Developmental Psychology studies individuals biologically, psychologically, and socially throughout the developmental process from conception to death.
- Cognitive Psychology studies mental processes such as perception of stimuli, forgetting, retaining information in one's minds, making judgements, perception, attention, memory, and reasoning.
- Industrial and Organizational Psychology examines topics related to the productivity of organizations such as management, leadership, and employee motivation in the business world.
- Social Psychology studies the impacts of social structures on individual behavior by examining individual behaviors in a social context.
- Educational Psychology discusses the basic mechanisms of the learning process within the stimulus-response relationship.
